Monterey Police Department (MPD) Highlights  
January 2017

NARRATIVE

- The Community Action Team (CAT) participated in Community Outreach at the Monterey Homeless Exchange and at the Gathering for Women.
- CAT participated in “Coffee with a Cop” at the Del Monte Center.
- A Monterey Police Officer investigating a residential burglary located and arrested the subject.
- The Community Action Team continues to work with the newly assigned Monterey County Behavioral Health Mobile Crisis Worker and met with service providers for long term treatment and care for two chronic arrestees.
- A Monterey Police Officer’s efforts led to the arrest of two suspects for possession of stolen property.
- MPD detectives and the Peninsula Regional Violence and Narcotics Team (PRVNT) continue to investigate violent crime and narcotics on the Peninsula.
- PRVNT was instrumental in the Seaside homicide conviction of a Sureno gang member. He faces 100 years to life when sentenced. His partner pled guilty and will receive a 50 years to life sentence for two homicides and several attempted homicide.
- Staffing
  - Staffing continues to be a priority for the MPD. The MPD consistently has between 10-20% of the sworn workforce not fully functioning (injured, ill, training, vacation). Fifty-one sworn is the number that should be fully functional, an increase of 10-20% (5-10 additional sworn officers) would account for personnel that are not fully functional.
  - Sworn (as of 01/31/17)
    - 51 authorized (-3 unfilled / -3 extended leave / -4 training / -1 pre-academy - 22%)
  - Non-Sworn (as of 01/31/17)
    - 19 authorized (-1 PST unfilled / -1 CSO / -1 AAll extended leave – 16%)

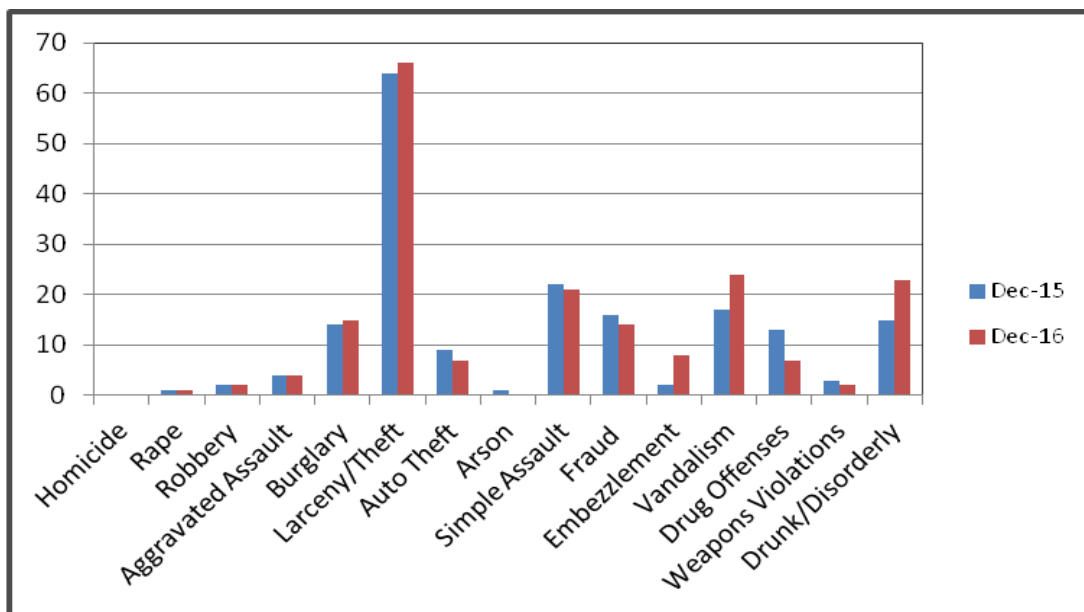


Table B – 2015 Monthly Average v. December 2016
