

Report to City Manager
Monterey Police Department (MPD) Highlights
February 2017

NARRATIVE

- An MPD investigation, with the assistance of PRVNT and Monterey County Probation, led to the identification and apprehension of five robbery suspects.
- An MPD Officer arrested a car thief after stopping the subject for traffic violations. The suspect matched the image of a car thief reported earlier in the week and the officer learned that the subject's driver's license was suspended and that he was in possession of burglary tools and drug paraphernalia.
- The Community Action Team (CAT) continues to participate in Community Outreach. A CAT officer discussed community issues and collaborated on solutions with participants of a community nature walk in the Laguna Grande Park.
- PRVNT continues to actively investigate crime throughout the peninsula. Some of PRVNTs work during February includes: serving a search warrant in Seaside which resulted in arrests for controlled substances and firearms violations; conducting a probation search in Pacific Grove which resulted in arrests for possession of a controlled substance, child endangerment, firearms violations (three of the seized firearms were reported stolen from Monterey) and possession of stolen property; and assisting in several investigations regarding multiple residential burglaries in Monterey, Carmel, Pacific Grove, and the County jurisdictions, which led to an arrest.
- Staffing
 - Staffing continues to be a priority for the MPD. The MPD consistently has between 10-20% of the sworn workforce not fully functioning (injured, ill, training, vacation). Fifty-one sworn is the number that should be fully functional, an increase of 10-20% (5-10 additional sworn officers) would account for personnel that are not fully functional.
 - Sworn (as of 02/28/17)
 - 51 authorized (-3 unfilled / -3 extended leave / -4 training / -1 pre-academy - 22%)
 - Non-Sworn (as of 02/28/17)
 - 19 authorized (-1 PST unfilled / -1 CSO / -1 AAll extended leave – 16%)

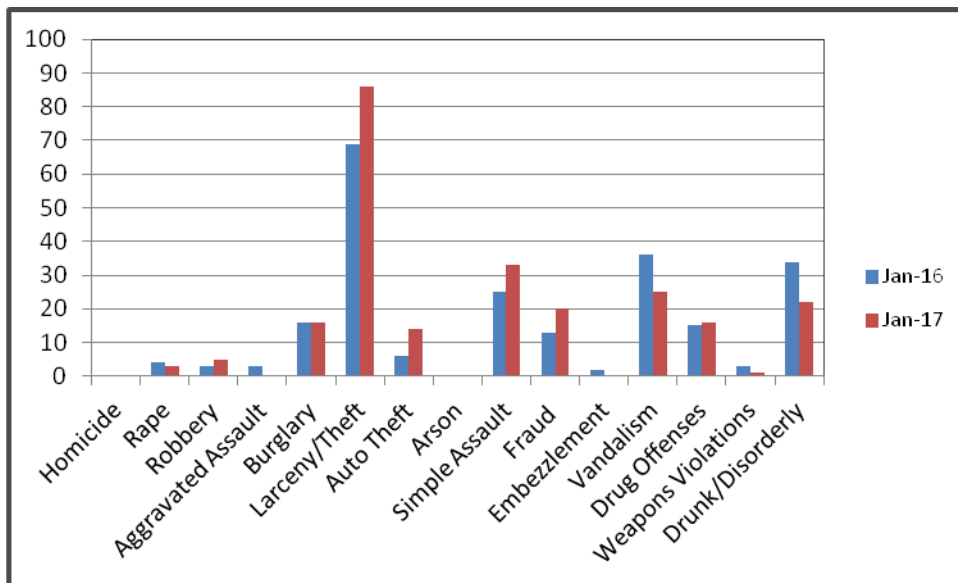


Table B – 2016 Monthly Average v. January 2017
