Monterey Police Department (MPD) Highlights  
August 2017

NARRATIVE

- On August 29, five new officers were sworn-in as Monterey Police Officers and Lieutenant William Clark was sworn in as the Assistant Chief of Police.
- The Community Action Team (CAT) continues to participate in community outreach. CAT attended National Night Out celebrations in Seaside and Pacific Grove. CAT also attended a Monterey community 'block party' on August 26.
- Officers dispatched to a burglary in progress identified and arrested three burglary suspects.
- A Monterey Police Officer was commended for demonstrating courage and calm; and for his heroic life saving efforts while responding to a life threatening vehicle collision.
- MPD hosted a city-wide homeless liaison meeting. The goal was to collaborate with other city departments on homeless issues affecting the departments, discuss available resources, and potential solutions. The group will meet monthly.

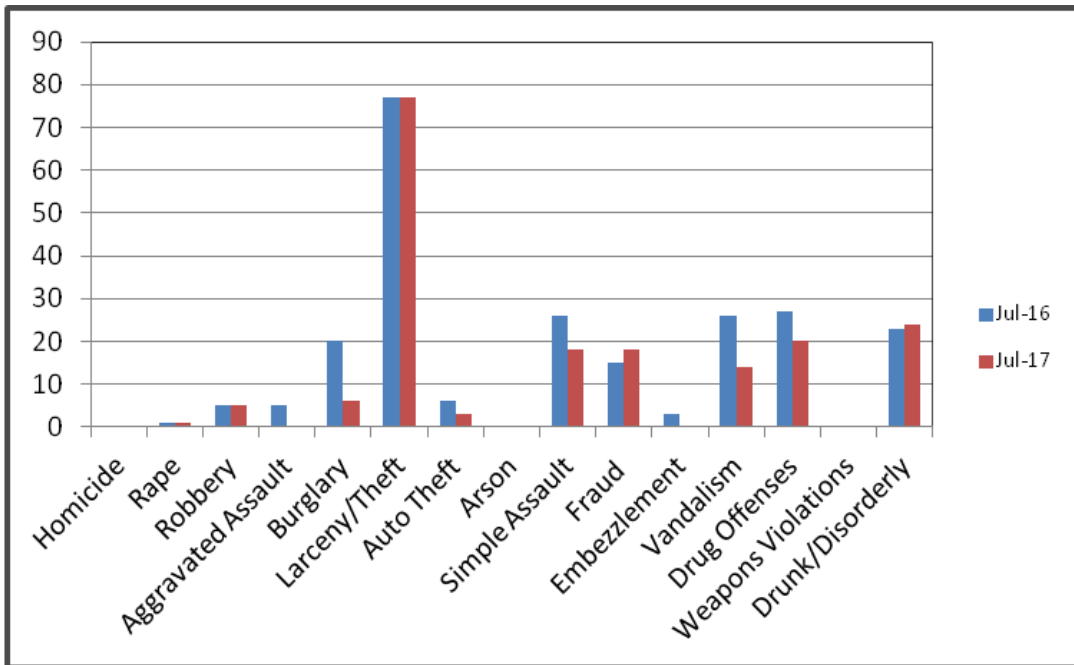


Table B – 2016 Monthly Average v. July 2017
