

Report to City Manager
Monterey Police Department (MPD) Highlights
January 2018

NARRATIVE

- The MPD added to Traffic Officers to the patrol structure in January. The officers will enforce traffic rules and regulations, educate the public on traffic laws and work with traffic engineering to identify and resolve traffic related issues.
- The MPD had four trainees graduate the MPD field training program.
- A patrol officer identified a recently reported stolen vehicle and the suspect was taken into custody.
- A patrol officer, who took a counterfeit bill report in the morning, was able to locate and arrest a suspect by the end of the day.
- Officers responded to a report of two subjects fighting armed with a knife and a baseball bat. The officers were able to detain and safely arrest a suspect for assault with a deadly weapon and domestic violence.
- An officer's surveillance of a local residence led to three arrests for various narcotics charges. A warrant at the same location led to the recovery of heroin and a shotgun and the arrest of two additional subjects for narcotics violations and a Post Release Community Supervision (PRCS) hold.
- Community Action Team (CAT) officers met a 5 ½ year old boy at California Pizza Kitchen (CPK) on January 18. The boy has been diagnosed with terminal brain cancer and was on his "Make A Wish" tour. His tour was ending at Disney World, but it started with dinner at CPK. He loves super heroes and wanted to meet Police officers and firefighters.
- The MPD School Resource Officer (SRO) organized a "Junior Police Officer" program at Walter Colton School. The officer planned a seven exercise curriculum for the children ranging from taking a tour of the MPD station to lifting their own fingerprints. This new curriculum will start in February and finish prior to the end of the school year.
- The Peninsula Regional Violence and Narcotics Team (PRVNT) assisted Marina with the investigation of an armed robbery. Marina PD arrested a subject with a firearm consistent with the one used in the robbery. PRVNT authored a search warrant of the suspect's home and located the victim's property. An AK-47 style assault rifle was also located.
- The PRVNT assisted the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) with multiple parolee searches. The arrests included one parolee in Monterey who was in violation of the terms of their parole.
- The PRVNT arrested a suspect with multiple warrants who had been involved in multiple vehicle pursuits throughout Monterey County.

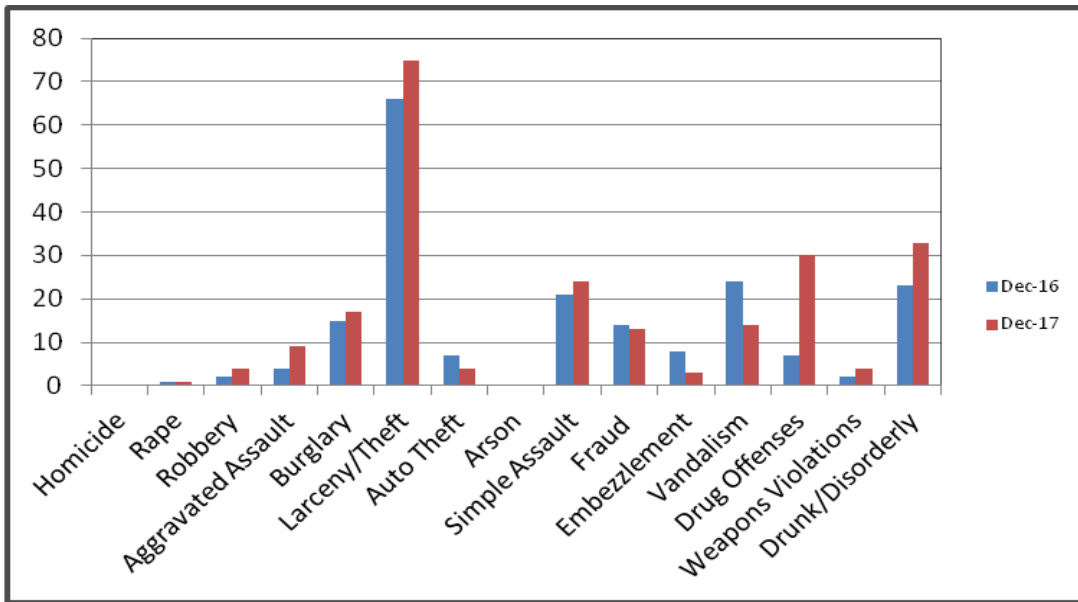


Table B – 2016 Monthly Average v. December 2017
