

Report to City Manager  
Monterey Police Department (MPD) Highlights  
April 2018

NARRATIVE

- The School Resource Officer (SRO) facilitated two Junior Police Club meetings at Walter Colton Middle School highlighting AMR paramedics and the Monterey Fire Department. The Junior Police Club meeting with AMR was featured in the Monterey Herald.
- The SRO attended a Peninsula wide meeting of school districts and families featuring emotional support for students. The focus was on identifying troubled students before violence occurs. Approximately 150 parents were in attendance.
- The SRO visited four Kindergarten classes at La Mesa Elementary as part of the school's "Community Helpers" series.
- The Community Action Team (CAT) and Patrol hosted 'Coffee with a Cop' at Plumes. Approximately twenty community members attended.
- Collaborative efforts by the CAT and the Monterey County Homeless Exchange have resulted in numerous success stories in the homeless community. One woman was admitted to CHOMP, another has stayed sober for two months and is now helping other women at the 'Gathering for Women' shelter, and a chronically homeless man was provided temporary housing by Interim, Inc.
- MPD Detectives arrested a suspect responsible for multiple check fraud cases on the Monterey Peninsula.
- The MPD provided Active Shooter Update simulation training to the majority of officers in April and will provide the training to the remaining officers in the upcoming months.
- The two MPD Traffic officers graduated from the eighty-hour POST motorcycle course and will be providing traffic calming on motorcycles.
- MPD provided security for the Big Little Lies series filming. The filming schedule changed multiple times with very short notice. MPD staff adjusted and the production crew complimented MPD on their professionalism and positive attitude.
- Another great example of de-escalation techniques occurred when MPD officers responded to a report of a mentally unstable subject who stabbed himself multiple times in the foot. The subject was reported to be a previous military member diagnosed with PTSD. Officers were able to talk to the subject and take him into custody without incident.

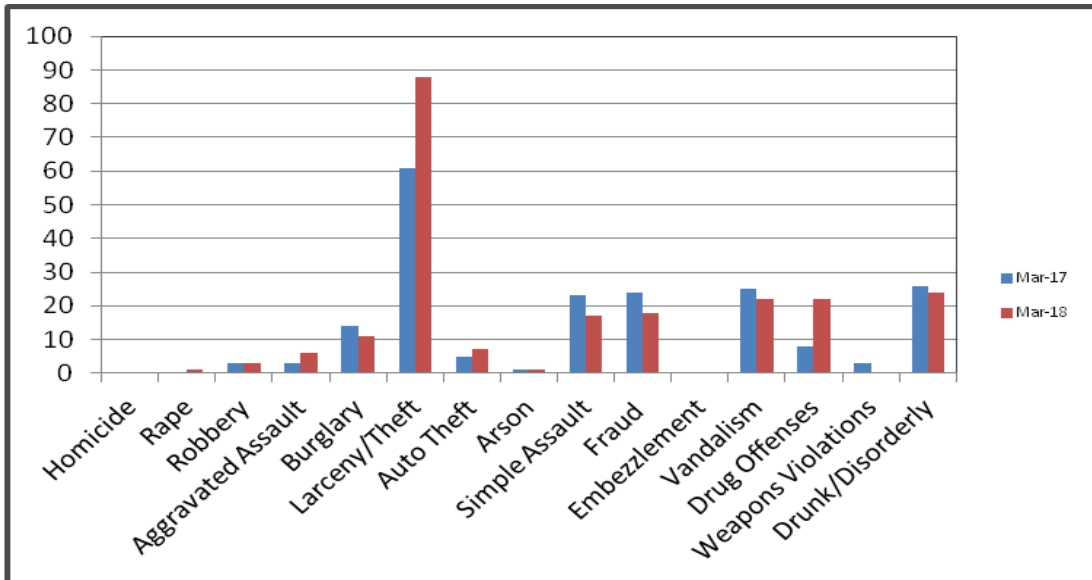


Table A – March 2017 v. March 2018
