

Report to City Manager
Monterey Police Department (MPD) Highlights
May 2018

NARRATIVE

- The MPD created the Burglary and Theft Team (BaTT). This team is comprised of officers working overtime on days off to address property crimes in Monterey. BaTT conducted operations in May which resulted in seventeen arrests for drug and property related crimes.
- The Community Action Team (CAT) worked with SafePlace and Veterans Park personnel to ensure a family with a newborn child had a place to stay until they were accepted into an apartment.
- The CAT attended Coffee with A Cop at the Starbucks on Lighthouse.
- The CAT assisted Patrol with staffing for the Cali Roots Festival, BaTT investigations, and the Big Little Lies filming.
- The School Resource Officer (SRO) organized a Junior Police Club meeting with a State Parks Lifeguard and explored careers as a Lifeguard or Ranger. The club also had its final meeting of the school year which included a team building experience at the CSUMB ROPES challenge course. Club members were presented with certificates of completion and commemorative Jr. Police pens.
- Four new Community Services Officer Interns (part-time) were hired in May. They will work with the MPD Community Action Team to provide patrols downtown, along the waterfront and Cannery Row.
- Nine officers assisted at the Cali Roots Festival from May 25 through May 27. There were approximately 10,000 people in attendance each day. MPD made the following arrests (6) public intoxication, (1) trespassing, (1) driving on suspended license, (2) warrants.
- MPD officers conducted a traffic stop and observed the suspect and vehicle matched a Monterey Sheriff's Department bulletin for kidnapping. This information led to the suspect's arrest for the kidnapping.
- An MPD Investigations Division investigation of a burglary ring from the Bay Area led to the arrest of a suspect for burglary and gang enhancements.
- An MPD Patrol Officer arrested a burglary suspect and the subsequent investigation led to the recovery of stolen property from two additional burglaries.
- An MPD Patrol Officer observed a burglary in progress at the Transit Plaza which resulted in the suspects arrest and the discovery of the suspect's possession of burglary tools and counterfeit money.

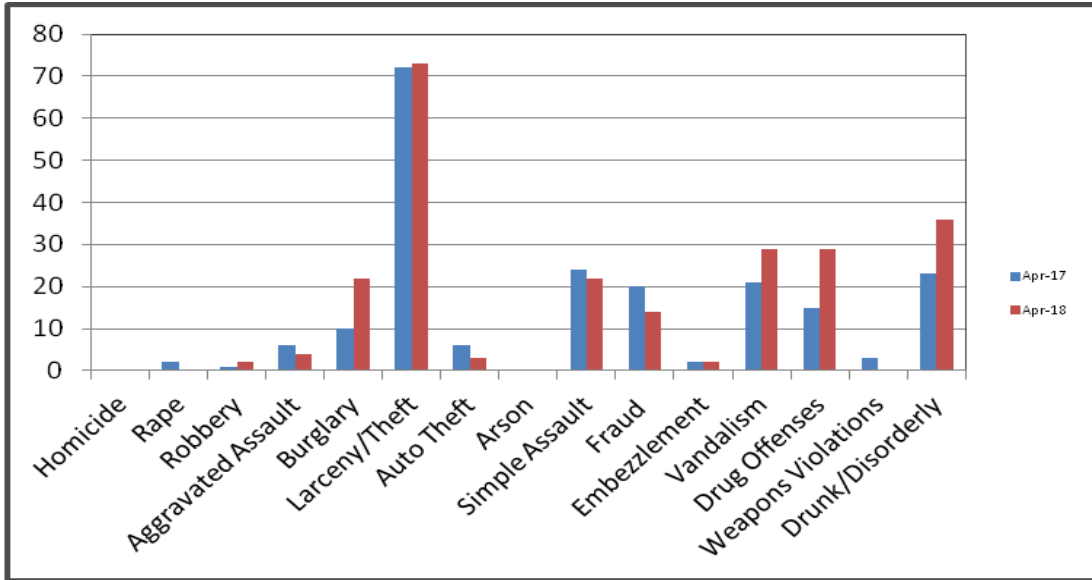


Table B – 2017 Monthly Average v. April 2018
