

# MONTHLY REPORT

## MONTEREY POLICE DEPARTMENT



### Narrative

- The Monterey Police Department (MPD) increased its presence on the various social media platforms by creating Instagram and YouTube accounts. The social media accounts are used to highlight great police work, connect with the community, and increase recruitment opportunities. MPD used the YouTube account to create a 30 second recruitment video and will add other recruitment and public safety videos to the channel. The MPD Instagram account is full of high quality photographs highlighting MPD work. In just a few weeks, MPD gained over 180 followers. In the past month, the MPD Facebook page had a 306% (50,400) increase in post reaches, a 236% (24,000) increase in post engagements, and an 82% (91) increase in followers.
- The Community Action Team (CAT) continues to provide community outreach. In August, the CAT participated in two station tours, National Night Out, the New Monterey Block Party, the Naval Post Graduate School Safety Drill and a Town Hall meeting.

### Continued..

- A probation search of a local residence led to the arrest of two suspects for possession of illegal assault rifles, possession of destructive devices and explosive materials, additional drug-related charges; and the seizure of approximately 112 firearms and explosive devices.
- The MPD hosted National Night Out Monterey on Tuesday, August 7. Numerous Police personnel assisted at the event.
- Monterey Police Officers were dispatched in March 2018 to a report of a home invasion robbery. A thorough investigation led to the arrest of two suspects. The suspects were convicted in August and sentenced to two years in state prison.
- Two Monterey Senior Police Service Technicians spent five hours completing the required CLETS entries for the weapons seized during the above mentioned probation search.

## Continued..

- Monterey Community Service Officers (CSOs) visited the Whispering Pines Day Camp this summer. They showed the campers equipment used by police officers and assisted the campers in weekly crossings on Munras Avenue during field trips.
- The MPD hosted a BBQ for the Citizens' Academy classes of 2017 and 2018. Approximately 40 individuals from both classes, along with City Manager Uslar and Council members Albert and Smith attended.
- Monterey Police Officers worked 70 hours at the Russo & Steel and RM Auctions; and 88 hours at the Exotics on Cannery Row event during Car Week. Monterey Police Explorers assisted with the Exotics on Cannery Row event.
- The School Resource Officer participated in the La Mesa PTA bicycle safety night at the La Mesa School. After giving a safety presentation, the officer rode the obstacle course with the children.
- A Monterey Police Officer responding to a report of mail theft located a vehicle matching the suspect vehicle. After initiating a traffic stop and conducting an investigation, the vehicle was found to be stolen. The suspect was arrested for possession of a stolen vehicle, possession of burglary tools, violation of probation, and various drug charges.

## Continued..

- The MPD has collaborated with a myriad of agencies to address homelessness, domestic violence, substance abuse and other quality of life issues. This collaboration led to the creation of the Multi-Disciplinary Outreach Team (MDOT) and includes the following:
  - Homeless Exchange - a monthly meeting between the MPD Community Action Team (CAT) and local social service providers.
  - City Liaison Group - a monthly meeting with multiple city department first line supervisors designed to address specific issues in the city of Monterey.
  - Adult Protective Services - a Monterey County social worker handles issues related to elderly or dependent adults.
  - Montage Health/CHOMP Community Outreach - a CHOMP social worker engages with people in our community that are homeless or are in danger of becoming homeless.
  - Monterey County Behavioral Health - a Monterey County crisis worker is available to handle calls or on-going problems related to individuals suffering from mental health-related issues.
  - YWCA Domestic Violence Advocate – the domestic violence (DV) advocate working out of MPD provides training on DV related issues and provides outreach to victims of domestic violence.

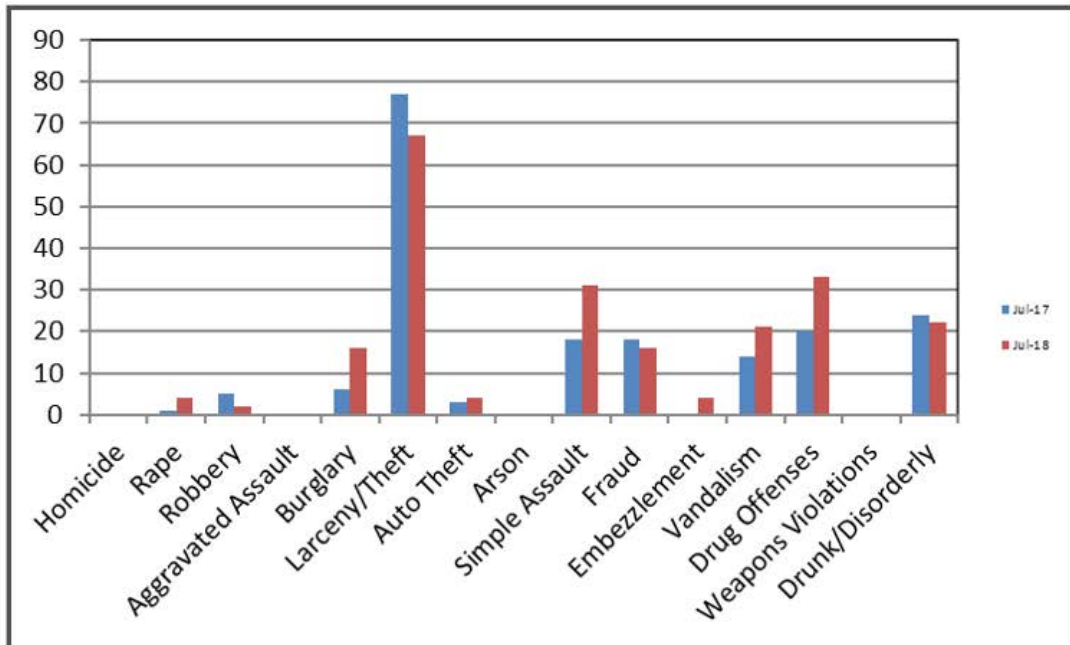


Table A – July 2017 v. July 2018

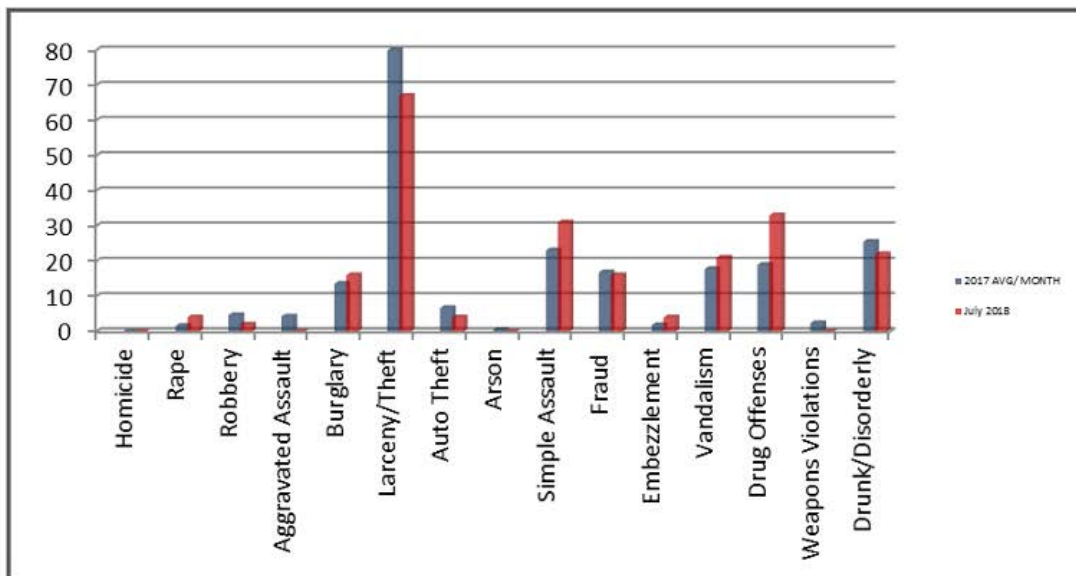


Table B – 2017 Monthly Average v. July 2018
