Narrative

- The Community Action Team (CAT)
 helped staff several special events in
 November including; the Cowboy
 Festival, First City Beer and Wine
 festival, and the Captain Bouchard
 Re-enactment.
- The CAT conducted three (3) massage parlor compliance checks and issued citations for violations of the Monterey City Code.
- The CAT conducted two (2) MPD station tours in November.
- A Monterey police officer's surveillance of a suspected stolen vehicle resulted in the arrest of the suspect.
- A Monterey police detective and two Monterey police officers conducting a strong-armed robbery investigation identified a parolee as a potential suspect. A search led to the recovery of stolen property, clothing used in the robbery and the suspect's arrest.

Narrative Cont...

- The Sand City Police Department was aware of a string of burglaries in Monterey and contacted the MPD Detectives after arresting a subject who had stolen property in the stolen vehicle he was driving. The investigation revealed stolen property from seven Monterey commercial burglaries.
- The Peninsula Regional Violence and Narcotics Team (PRVNT) arrested a wanted subject in Marina and recovered over one pound of narcotics including ten ounces of methamphetamine and one ounce of heroin.




Table A - October 2017 v. October 2018




Table B – 2017 Monthly Average v. October 2018
