## **MONTHLY REPORT**

#### MONTEREY POLICE DEPARTMENT



### **Narrative**

- The Community Action Team (CAT) organized and participated in Coffee with a Cop at a local coffee shop.
- The CAT hosted the monthly meeting for the Monterey Homeless Exchange.
- The Monterey SRO provided support to the newly hired Seaside SRO as he acclimated to his new assignment, collaborating on school presentations and student issues.
- MPD officers teamed up with Seaside police officers to address issues at Laguna Grande. The officers conducted park area walk-throughs and arrested two individuals. The City of Seaside will be clearing the debris left behind in the encampments.
- MPD officers responded to a call of a welfare check of an elderly woman who suffered from dementia.
   Officers arrived and heard the woman making noise, tried to talk to her through the door, heard the gas clicking of the stove and determined the gas was potentially on, forced entry and discovered the female trapped under a book case. The stove was on with gas filling the apartment. The officers rescued the female and got her the assistance she needed.

- MPD officers identified and arrested a suspect for stalking and for identity theft of a deceased person. A pellet gun was recovered during the arrest.
- MPD officers worked with the City Yard to create an RV wastewater pump. The RV pump will be used to pump wastewater from abandoned or unregistered recreational vehicles prior to towing. This had previously caused significant issues because tow companies would not remove RVs that had wastewater in them.
- The Peninsula Regional Violence and Narcotics Team (PRVNT) arrested a wanted parolee driving a car stolen from Monterey. A firearm was recovered from the vehicle.
- PRVNT arrested a wanted felon in Monterey who was in possession of narcotics for sale and was involved in pimping.
- Officers were dispatched to a report of a mentally unstable juvenile who had armed himself with a hockey stick and a football helmet. Officers utilized their Integrating Communications, Assessment, and Tactics (ICAT) de-escalation techniques to talk to the subject, calm him, make entry into the residence and detain the juvenile without injury to any parties involved.




Table A - December 2017 v. December 2018




Table B – 2017 Monthly Average v. December 2018
