

# MONTHLY REPORT

## MONTEREY POLICE DEPARTMENT



### Narrative

- A Monterey police detective and Monterey police officers worked with Del Rey Oaks Police Department and the District Attorney's Forensic Investigator to conduct an investigation that led to the arrest of an individual for sex with a minor, possessing child pornography, and providing marijuana to a minor.

#### School Resource Officer

- The Monterey SRO taught a series of three one-hour lessons on bullying prevention to two fifth grade classes at La Mesa School. This pilot program will be expanded to other interested elementary schools in October, which is bullying awareness month.
- Members of the Monterey Peninsula Special Response Unit (SRU) were guest speakers at the Colton Junior Police Club. Students learned how SRU teams are used to resolve critical incidents and saw a demonstration on the use of the tactical robot and armored vehicle.

#### Community Action Team

- Organized "Coffee with a Cop" at Starbucks on Cannery Row.
- In conjunction with patrol, provided "habitual drunkard" informational letters to local alcohol establishments in an effort to deter sales of alcohol to habitual drunkards.

#### Community Action Team Cont..

- Provided traffic control training to the Parks and Recreation Department.
- Worked with the U.S. Marshal's office to locate and arrest a violent sex offender out of Indiana who was a local transient.

#### Multi-Disciplinary Outreach Team (MDOT)

- The Monterey Police Department and City of Monterey, Monterey County District Attorney's Office, Monterey County Adult Protective Services, Montage Health/Community Health Innovations, Monterey County Behavioral Health, and the local YWCA held a joint media conference to introduce the Multi-Disciplinary Outreach Team (MDOT). MDOT evolved from both the Homeless Exchange and a City Liaison group, led by the Monterey Police Department. This collaboration has developed strong connections that have resulted in team problem solving efforts for long-lasting solutions for those who may be homeless and others.
- Moved one female into transitional housing, placed one female in rehabilitation in Santa Barbara, moved one male into a hotel room and placed another in the Bridge Program.

**Peninsula Regional Violence and Narcotics Team**

- Monterey police detectives and the Peninsula Regional Violence and Narcotics Team (PRVNT) arrested a male in Monterey for committing a home invasion burglary in Santa Cruz County.
- PRVNT arrested two males in Seaside for possession of methamphetamine for sales.

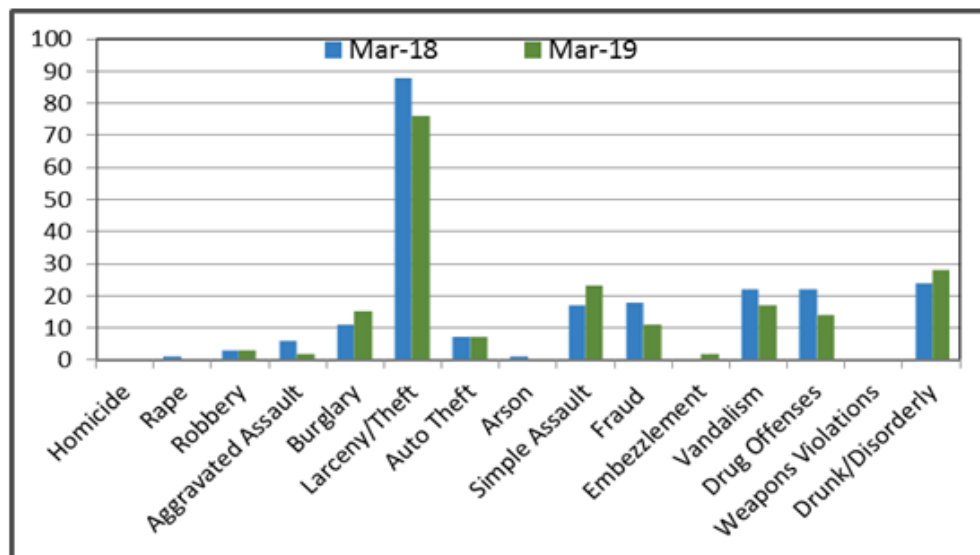


Table A – March 2018 v. March 2019

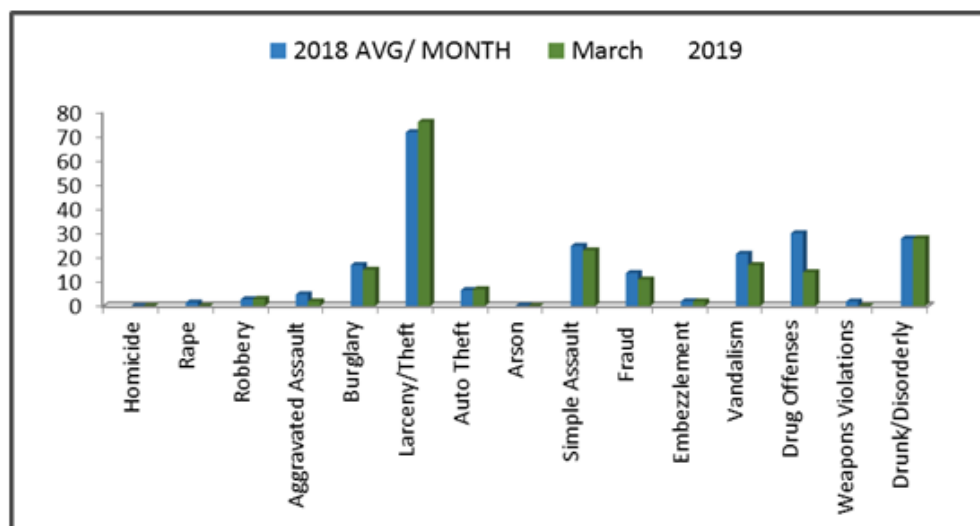


Table B – 2018 Monthly Average v. March 2019
