Narrative

Patrol

- One Dayshift team handled (8) arrests in a single day, including locating a prowler with burglary tools and a felony warrant suspect.
- A patrol officer took a stolen bicycle report at the beginning of his workweek, and located the stolen property across town several days later, which led to returning the bike to the owner.
- Patrol officers were able to assist another local police department in locating and safely contacting a suicidal subject in possession of a handgun. The person was detained and subsequently referred for mental health treatment.

Community Action Team

- CAT met with the Del Monte Beach Neighborhood Association.
- CAT abated (43) encampments and provided information to the campers regarding services available to the homeless. Most camps were abated (28) along the Rec Trail / Windows on the Bay / Del Monte Beach and Robert's Lake areas.
- The Community Services Officers provided one station tour and assisted with "Halloween on the Wharf", "Trunk or Treat", Halloween Safety at the Hilltop Park "Pumpkin Patch", the Wharf birthday, and Language Day.
- CAT officers spent (5) hours covering patrol assignments.

Monterey School Resource Officer (SRO)

- SRO Galin presented the "Be Bully Free" workshop at Bayview and Monte Vista Schools.
- La Mesa, Monte Vista, Foothill and Bayview schools have all had this series of three presentations on bullying prevention.
- SRO Galin made a presentation about current drug use and abuse trends to parents of Monterey High students.

Investigations

- MPD detectives identified the local Lottery Ticket Burglars. MPD worked with outside agencies to conduct the arrest and subsequent search warrant service.
- Detectives arrested a well-known local burglar with multiple prior arrests for burglary.
- Detectives identified a suspect in multiple thefts of sunglasses from a business and confirmed that the suspect was also involved in a separate nighttime commercial burglary.

Peninsula Regional Violence and Narcotics Team (PRVNT)

- After a noticeable increase in drug related overdoses on the peninsula, PRVNT detectives arrested (3) suspects that were involved in drug sales, including the possession of pills suspected of containing fentanyl.



Multi-Disciplinary Outreach Team (MDOT)

- MDOT members gave a presentation about MDOT's efforts to the California Welfare Directors Association.
- MDOT arranged for a job interview at a local business for a member of our local homeless community.
- MDOT moved a homeless veteran into the Veteran's Transition Center.
- MDOT collaborated with Sun Street Center to help a well-known homeless man into residential rehabilitation.
- MDOT moved a homeless mother into the warming shelter and provided her with bus fare so she and her child could travel from the shelter to the peninsula.
- MDOT provided a homeless mother with a car seat.
