MONTEREY POLICE DEPARTMENT



Narrative

- A Monterey police officer investigated a commercial burglary. While off duty, she recognized the suspect vehicle and was able to identify the two suspects from the registration of the license plate she observed on the car.
- Monterey officers responded to a collision at Del Monte Shopping Center and learned that the subjects involved in the collision were fleeing the scene after committing a theft. The officers were able to conduct an extensive search and located the suspects in different areas and found they had outstanding warrants for their arrests and gang affiliations.
- A Monterey officer's investigation led to the arrest of two suspects for possession of controlled substances, possession of stolen property and burglary tools.
- A Monterey officer's investigation led to the arrest of two suspects for vandalism and possession of controlled substances.

Community Action Team

- CAT hosted Coffee with a Cop at Alta Café.
- CAT participated in "Playdate with a Cop" at My Museum.
- CAT hosted the monthly Homeless Exchange meeting.

Multi-Disciplinary Outreach Team (MDOT)

- The CAT and MDOT conducted a premise check of the Old Capitol Site and located 22 camps. Numerous flyers were provided during the camp abatement.
- MDOT developed a "Hot List" and collaborated with the County Jail to locate resources for those incarcerated.

School Resource Officer

- The SRO attended the Special Olympics at Monterey Peninsula College with Monterey Police Community Services Officers to support MPUSD students who were participating.
- The SRO met four times with the Junior Police Club at Colton School. MPD, MFD, a Corrections Officer from Juvenile Hall and a Marina Police K9 handler gave presentations at the meetings.
- The SRO was invited to give a career presentation to a tenth grade class at Monterey High School.
- The SRO and the CAT sergeant met with representatives from the Sun Street Drug Rehabilitation Center and discussed how to reduce drug use in Monterey schools.
- The SRO presented the SRO program and juvenile law processes to the MPD Citizens' Academy.

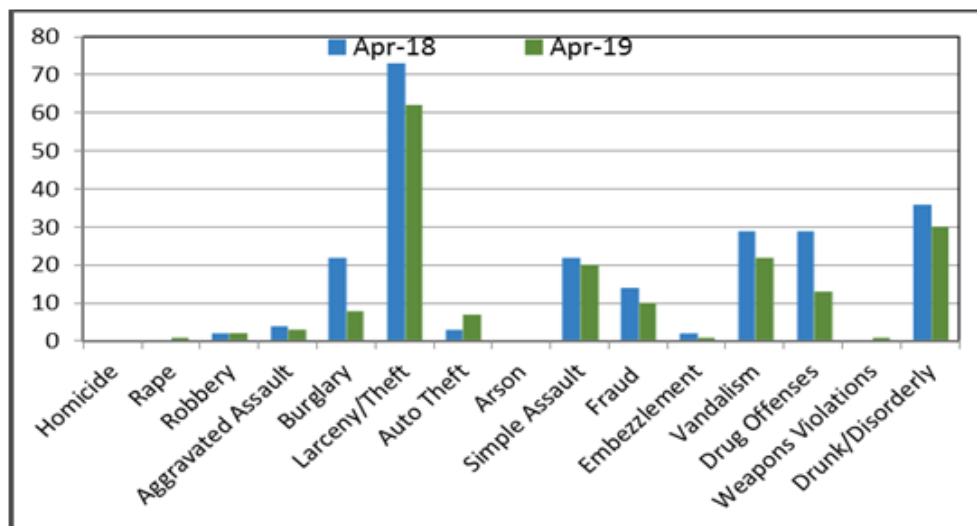


Table A – April 2018 v. April 2019

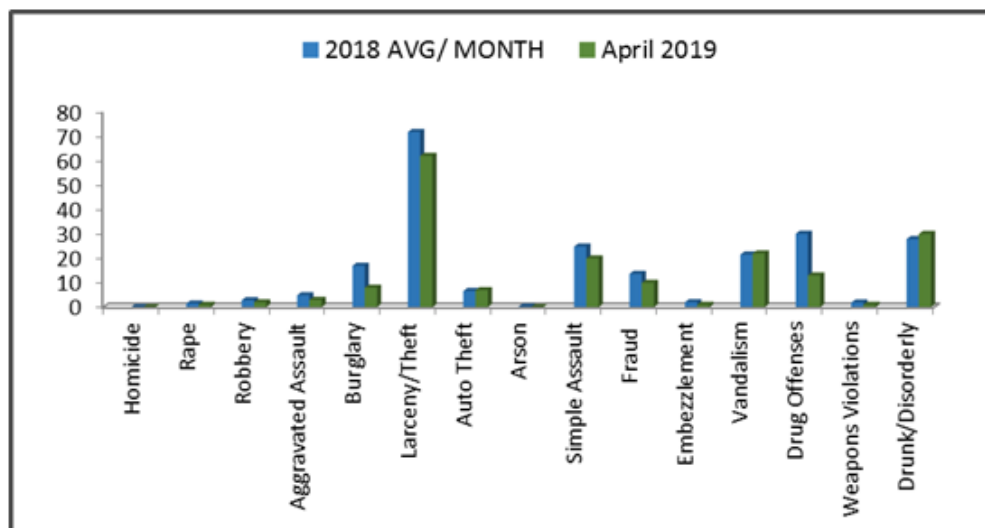


Table B – 2018 Monthly Average v. April 2019
