Narrative

Patrol

- After eleven months, two MPD Officers who were hired in March 2019 have completed the academy and their Field Training Officer program and are now – “street-ready” solo-patrol officers.
- An MPD Officer observed a subject riding a bike similar to one that was reported stolen. The officer stopped the subject and the bike was positively identified as the one which was stolen. The officer arrested the subject.
- Monterey Police Officers, CAT, and MDOT responded to a domestic disturbance with an attempted suicide. The officers utilized their Integrating Communications, Assessment, and Tactics (ICAT) training to remove the children from the second story of the home and render aid. MDOT and Monterey officers provided resources and emotional support following the incident.

Community Action Team

- CAT abated (52) encampments; twenty-two of those were on Del Monte Beach. Flyers with information regarding services available to the homeless were provided.
- CAT provided (1) police station tour in January.

Multi-Disciplinary Outreach Team (MDOT)

- MDOT responded to MPD jail to assist with the assessment of a local homeless person who was in custody to determine what services could be provided.
- MDOT assisted a stranded female by providing her with services and transporting her home.

Monterey School Resource Officer (SRO)

- The SRO recruited Walter Colton Students for the upcoming Junior Police Club class and educated the students about a career in law enforcement.
- The SRO gave a motivational presentation on perseverance to a class at Monterey High School.
- The SRO completed a review of the school’s safety plans.
- The SRO recognized a Seaside shooting suspect as a Monterey High School student. The suspect was located and arrested.

Investigations

- MPD detectives, conducting a probation search, made two misdemeanor arrests after finding drug paraphernalia and narcotics.
- MPD detectives conducted a probation search, which yielded two warrant arrests, evidence from an identity theft, drug paraphernalia and the recovery of stolen bicycles.
- MPD detectives investigating an identity theft case located and arrested two suspects for the identity theft, possession of methamphetamine, possession of heroin, and possession of drug paraphernalia.
- An MPD detective investigated a case of lewd and lascivious conduct with a child and booked the subject after obtaining a full confession.

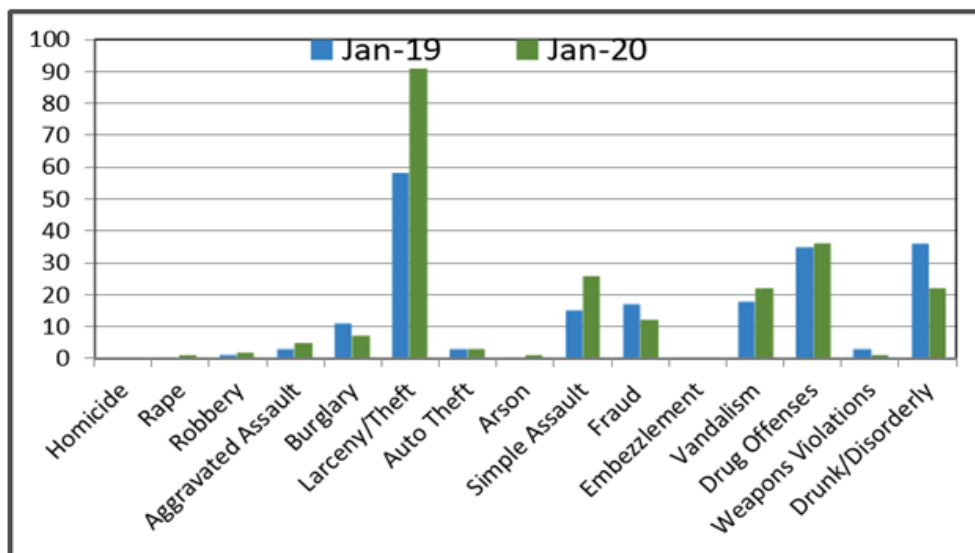


Table A – January 2019 v. January 2020

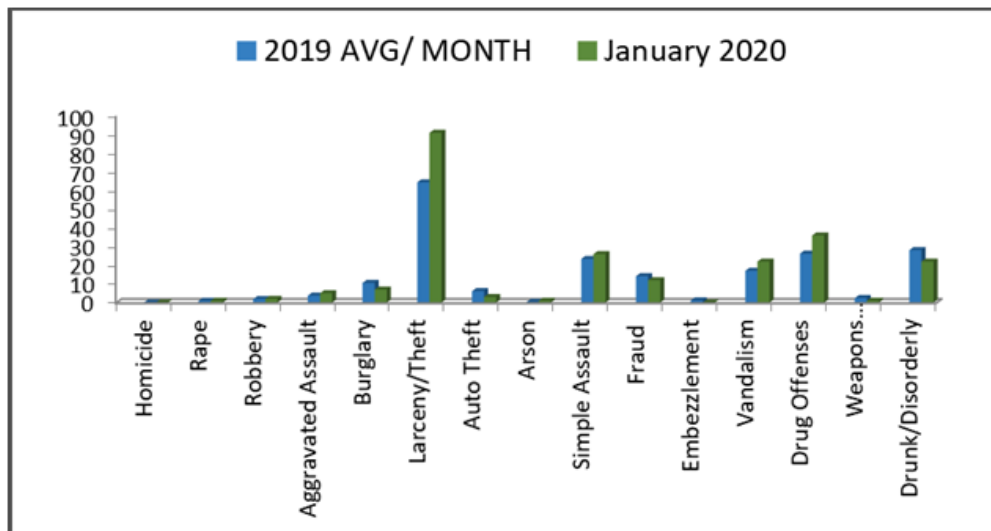


Table B – 2019 Monthly Average v. January 2020
