
# **MONTHLY REPORT**

## **Narrative**

#### COVID-19

- On March 10, 2020, the MPD Command staff issued the first MPD Memorandum addressing issues relating to COVID-19. Since that time, the MPD has researched the most contemporary ways to serve the community while ensuring the workforce is protected from the virus. The MPD has altered many of the ways it does business which has resulted in new policy creation. Contingencies have been considered and planned for in the event the workforce becomes infected. Nineteen procedural memorandums have been issued since March 10th to adapt law enforcement services to the COVID-19 Pandemic.
- The MPD initiated the Incident Command System (ICS) and has had a member actively assigned and assisting the City Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and has coordinated with the County Emergency Operations Center. This ensures coordination and cooperation among all facets of the local, state and federal government.
- Early into the pandemic, the MPD had staff actively obtaining Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for the MPD and the City as a whole.
- The MPD continues to work through understanding, appropriately educating and if needed enforcing the County Shelter In Place (SIP) order. This has been in coordination with the Monterey County District Attorney, Monterey County Health Officer and the City Attorney's Office.

#### **Patrol**

- An officer located a lost sea lion on the Recreation Trail after a passer-by called police.
   The officer called the Marine Mammal Center and the sea lion is rehabilitating at the Moss Landing facility. The MPD also learned the difference between a sea lion and a seal.
- Officers were dispatched to a residential burglary in progress and after surrounding the house and coordinating a tactical plan, arrested the suspect without incident.

# Multi-Disciplinary Outreach Team (MDOT)

- MDOT assisted in placing an elderly subject in a skilled nursing facility in Utah.
- MDOT provided professional clothing and a cellular phone for a local subject that they had previously assisted and had recently completed a substance abuse program in Santa Barbara.

#### **Community Action Team (CAT)**

- CAT abated (47) encampments. Eighteen of those were at Windows on the Bay Park and (11) were at Don Dahvee Park. Officers provided flyers to homeless persons with information regarding services available to them.
- CAT officers walked (118) foot patrol hours and participated in (48) hours of training.

### **Narrative**

### School Resource Officer (SRO)

- Early in March, prior to the COVID pandemic:
  - The SRO and a Traffic officer visited Serendipity Pre-School for a career presentation. The officers spoke to the students about a career in policing and showed them a police vehicle and motorcycle.
  - The SRO hosted the first and second classes of the Junior Police Club at Colton Middle School.
  - During the first class, the SRO introduced a California State Parks Lifeguard to the club. The lifeguard explained their job and duties. The students were able to learn about ocean and water safety and lifeguard equipment. In the second class, the SRO and a CAT officer conducted a crime scene investigation presentation at Colton Middle School. The students were able to learn crime investigation techniques and practice dusting for fingerprints.

#### **Investigations**

- Detectives conducted an investigation of a commercial burglary on Wharf 1, which led to the identification of a suspect through video surveillance.
- Detectives arrested a subject for a felony warrant, searched their vehicle and recovered stolen property. This investigation closed several cases.
- A detective utilized video surveillance to identify the same suspect in four vehicle burglary cases, where credit cards had been stolen and used at local businesses. The suspect was arrested and charged with multiple counts of identify theft, shoplifting and theft with access cards.
- Detectives obtained a search warrant and a gun violence restraining order after a subject threatened his roommate with a gun. Detectives seized six handguns, four rifles, one shotgun and thousands of rounds of ammunition.
- Detectives investigated a stabbing and obtained a search warrant, which resulted in the arrest of a suspect for a domestic violence related attempted murder.






Table B - 2019 Monthly Average v. March 2020
