Narrative

COVID-19

- The MPD continued to adjust to the issues surrounding COVID-19 pandemic.
- The MPD continued to work through understanding, appropriately educating and if needed enforcing the County Shelter In Place (SIP) order. This has been in coordination with the Monterey County District Attorney, Monterey County Health Officer and the City Attorney's Office.
- On April 29 the City of Monterey restricted beach access except for physical activity to prevent the spread of COVID-19. The MPD attempted to obtain voluntary compliance over enforcement.



Patrol

- MPD participated in "Denim Day" to show support for those who have been victimized by Sexual assault. This program is sponsored by the Monterey County Rape Crisis Center.
- Monterey Police Officers responded to a call of a prowler. While looking for the prowler a second call came in from the same neighborhood relating that a subject had broken into a home and was fighting with the homeowner. MPD Officers entered the home and found the homeowner struggling with the suspect. The suspect continued to fight with officers, biting one of them. Officers were able to subdue and arrest the suspect. Officers determined the suspect was the same person who had been prowling at the first home. Detectives conducted an in-depth investigation and the District Attorney filed attempted murder charges against the suspect.
- Officers observed a stolen vehicle in the Municipal Wharf 2 parking lot and located a suspect inside the vehicle. Officers utilized negotiation and less-lethal techniques to apprehend the suspect after he refused to exit the vehicle.
- MPD Officers were dispatched to a hotel on reports of persons trespassing. Officers located and arrested two suspects for trespassing and possession of stolen property. The stolen property was from the hotel and multiple victims and included; mail, credit cards, identification cards, keys from a stolen vehicle and electronics.
- MPD took part in a small procession at the Carmel Hills Care Center to let residents and staff know they are appreciated.



Narrative

Community Action Team (CAT)

- CAT tagged (64) encampments and abated (21). Officers provided flyers to homeless persons with information regarding services available to them.
- CAT provided cloth masks and bottles of disinfectant at the 'Safe Place' and 'Gathering for Women' facilities.
- CAT officers walked (221) foot patrol hours and participated in (14) hours of training.
- CAT started tracking the MPD administration of Narcan to persons who were showing symptoms of overdosing on opioid's so they could attempt to follow-up with them and see what kinds of services may be needed.

Multi-Disciplinary Outreach Team (MDOT)

- MDOT assisted a subject who was suffering from mental illness that was stranded in Monterey. MDOT was able to obtain treatment and transportation for assistance in San Jose.

School Resource Officer (SRO)

- The SRO coordinated with school administration to offer any assistance staff or students may need during the COVID-19 quarantine.
- The SRO presented a virtual video on a career in law enforcement for Monterey High School.

Investigations

- MPD Detectives conducted proactive surveillance on (30) businesses for violations of Shelter-In-Place orders. One citation was issued.
- Detectives conducted an investigation into false identification and were able to link three cases to the same suspect based on video evidence.
- MPD detectives assisted patrol with in investigating a case that involved (7) victims of vehicle burglaries in Monterey and the Bay Area. MPD located a large amount of stolen property from the burglaries.

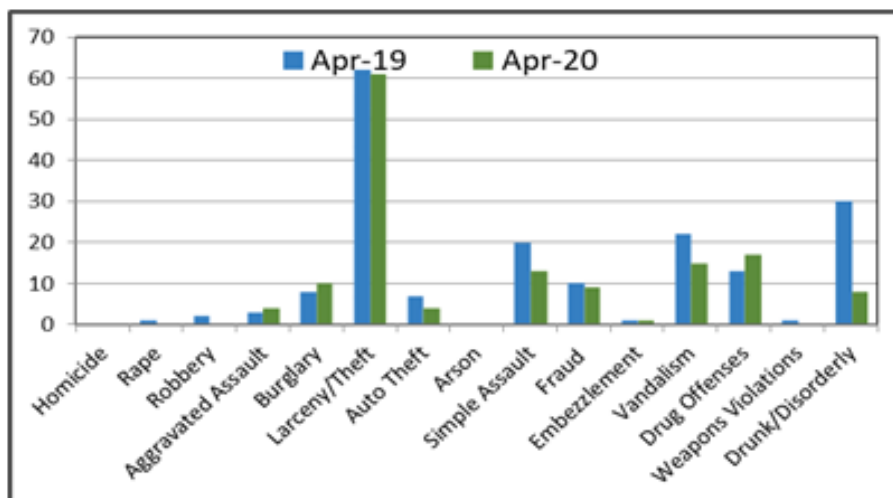


Table A – April 2019 v. April 2020

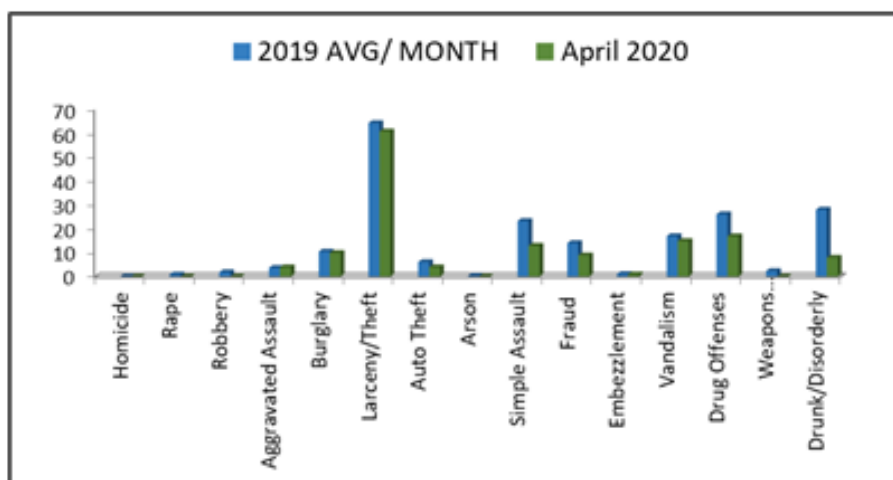


Table B – 2019 Monthly Average v. April 2020
