# **MPD Holiday Toy Drive**

The Monterey Police Department held its second-annual Holiday Toy Drive. With the help of our partners in the Multi-Disciplinary Outreach Team (MDOT) and our local schools, the MPD identified families who were in need this holiday season. The Gathering for Women and every employee of the MPD donated to this project. These donations allowed the MPD to provide gifts for 28 children and gift cards for their 7 families.

On 12/22/2021, a caravan of festive Monterey Police Vehicles picked up Santa and Buddy Brandon the elf at the Monterey Airport. With their sacks full of presents, Santa, Buddy Brandon, and Monterey Police Officers traveled all around Monterey delivering presents.

# Patrol

- 12-02-2021- MPD responded to a report of an attempted sexual assault at Del Monte Beach. A female reported a male had attacked her. The female was able to fight the suspect off, and the suspect fled. Officers located the suspect on the recreation trail, arrested him, and booked him at jail.
- 12-02-2021- MPD officers arrested a high school student after he stated that he was going to, "shoot up the school." Officers transported the student to Juvenile Hall.
- 12-04-2021- Officers responded to a solo vehicle collision in Monterey. The driver had been driving under the influence. Officers determined the driver was in possession of 1.19 pounds of marijuana and 1.99 grams of psilocybin mushrooms. Officers arrested and booked the driver in jail.
- 12-04-2021- The Seaside Police Department located and arrested a domestic violence suspect related to a Monterey case. The Monterey Police Department took custody of the suspect and booked him into jail.

# **Patrol Continued**

- 12-08-2021- The Monterey Police Department assisted the Carmel PD with a roadblock after three armed suspects entered a Carmel jewelry store and robbed the store utilizing hammers and a firearm. CHP located the suspect vehicle at Highway 1 North at Imjin. Two suspects were taken into custody.
- 12-11-2021- The Monterey PD assisted the Monterey Fire Department with a water rescue in which an unresponsive diver was brought to shore during an open-water dive. CPR was administered to the diver and an ambulance transported the diver to CHOMP where he regained a pulse.
- 12-12-2021- The Salinas Police Department located a theft suspect who was related to a Monterey Police Department case. Monterey police officers took custody of the suspect and booked the suspect for felony warrants and theft charges.
- 12-14-2021- The MPD placed numerous stop signs at intersections after 8 power poles, trees and power lines went down causing hazardous road conditions and power outages throughout the City.
- 12-14-2021- MPD assisted the Del Rey Oaks PD identify and locate a suspect who was involved in a crime in DRO. MPD officers located and arrested the suspect in Monterey and turned the suspect over to Del Rey Oaks PD.
- 12-22-2021- MPD officers responded to a stabbing in Monterey. The suspect admitted to the crime and officers took the suspect into custody. The Seaside Police Department located the female victim within their jurisdiction. The victim was transported to Natividad Hospital with non-life-threatening stab wounds to her chest and head. Officers booked the suspect into jail for attempted murder.

- 12-24-2021-Officers attempted to detain a subject for being in the center median, but the suspect fled. After a short foot pursuit, officers arrested the subject without incident.
- 12-24-2021- The CHP attempted to stop a driver who was driving erratically and led the CHP on a pursuit which entered the City of Monterey. The driver fled from the vehicle and the MPD and CHP established a perimeter of the area. Officers located both the driver and passenger and arrested the driver who was under the influence. The investigation was turned over to the CHP.
- 12-25-2021- MPD officers assisted Meals on Wheels deliver 24 meals to families throughout the city.
- 12-26-2021- MPD officers responded to a report of a suspicious person attempting to enter and burglarize a residence. Prior to officers' arrival the suspect left. After officers were on-scene and were speaking with the reporting party, the suspect returned to the residence and the reporting party positively identified the suspect. Officers conducted further investigation and determined that the suspect had also burglarized a neighboring residence. Officers arrested the suspect and booked him.
- 12-30-2021- Monterey Police Officers responded to a report of shots fired. On arrival, officers learned that the suspect threatened one of the victims and then drove away while firing multiple shots from a handgun towards the victims. None of the victims were struck or injured. Some of the victims knew who the suspect was, and officers were able to positively identify the suspect. The suspect's vehicle was located unoccupied however, the suspect was not located or arrested.

# Community Action Team (CAT)

- CAT participated in Christmas on the Wharf.
- Montage Health donated three electric bikes to the MPD. The MPD will utilize these bikes to conduct more bike patrols throughout the city. A very special thanks to Montage Health.



# Multidisciplinary Outreach Team (MDOT)

- CAT/ MDOT transported an unsheltered male to Sun Street Centers for treatment for alcohol addiction.
- CAT transported an adult female to the Department of Social Services office to pick up a copy of her medical card, and to Walgreens to pick up her prescription medications.
- CAT transported an unsheltered male to temporary housing.
- CAT/ MDOT was successful in placing an unsheltered elderly male suffering from dementia in a board-and-care facility.
- CAT assisted an unhoused male with transportation to CHOMP for medical treatment.
- CAT provided transportation to two unhoused individuals at Access Support Network. The subjects received minor medical treatments, food and assistance with scheduling appointments.
- CAT assisted an unhoused female with safe overnight parking through One Starfish Safe Parking and Supportive Services.
- MPD coordinated with Community Health Innovations and CSUMB to provide an unhoused male with placement in the Bridge rehabilitation program and a hotel voucher until his program starts.

# Case Study - John Doe 1221 (December 2021)

In an effort to explain some of the challenges faced by the MPD in trying to problem solve through a variety of ways, these case studies highlight aspects that the MPD and partners in MDOT face while attempting to resolve issues. This month's case study provides another challenging example.

- The Monterey Police Department (MPD) has had 229 contacts with John Doe 1221 from 2016 through 2021. The contacts primarily include public intoxication, Monterey City Code violations, probation violations and warrants arrests. He is on probation and his conditions include obeying all laws, not drink or possess alcoholic beverages and abstain from alcohol and places where alcohol is sold. For a two-year period between 2019 and 2021, Doe 1221 had twenty cases dismissed for furtherance of justice on the charges of public intoxication and disturbing the peace.
- John Doe 1221 is a military veteran and has resources and benefits available to him, however, does not avail himself of the resources. MDOT and CAT have obtained clothing from the Veterans Transition Center (VTC) and brought them to Doe 1221, have transported him to Monterey County Social Services for assistance, transported him to file his taxes and transported him to the DMV to obtain an identification card. MDOT and CAT continuously discuss resources with John Doe 1221, but he primarily relates that he just wants to drink.

# Narcan Administered Lifesaving

 MPD responded to an unresponsive male. An MPD officer administered one dose of Narcan with no effect. Monterey Fire and AMR personnel responded and administered more Narcan to the subject and revived the subject.

# Investigations / Monterey Police Anti-Crime Team (IMPACT)

- 12-02-2021- Monterey detectives assisted with a possible school violence threat and conducted the investigation into the situation. Officers took the suspect into custody and interviewed the suspect's family members and conducted a search of the suspect's residence. No weapons were located.
- 12-09-2021- Monterey detectives assisted the Seaside Police Department with surveillance of a location related to an on-going investigation. As a result of the investigation, officers arrested five suspects who were found in possession of stolen property and controlled substances.









Table B- Monthly Average v. December 2021
