MPD Commendation

Patrol

- 11-01-2022- MPD arrested a subject for felony vandalism and drunk in public.
- 11-07-2022- MPD responded to a report of a shooting. A victim and a suspect engaged in an incident of road rage while driving. The suspect followed the victim. The suspect shot a bullet at the victim's car trunk and then drove away. Officers arrived on the scene and located the victim uninjured. The investigation is ongoing.
- 11-09-2022- MPD responded to a report of a suspect with a knife battering two victims. Officers located one of the victims on the scene and the other at a bus stop, both with sustained injuries. AMR transported the victims to CHOMP for medical treatment. Officers located a subject matching the suspect's description near the scene, detained him, and located the knife. Officers arrested the subject and transported him to jail.
- 11-10-2022- MPD responded to a burglary in progress and set up a perimeter of the area. Officers located the suspect inside the building and arrested him. The suspect also had a felony warrant.
- 11-22-2022- An unhoused male got into an altercation with another unhoused male. One of the subjects brandished a piece of metal concealed up his sleeve. Officers located the subject on the beach nearby and took him into custody.
- 11-28-2022- MPD assisted the Seaside Police Department with locating evidence after a shooting occurred at multiple crime scenes.

11-29-2022- A group of four suspects confronted a group of unhoused people and demanded money. The suspects battered two victims causing facial injuries. One of the victims sustained a large laceration on his hand after the suspects pushed him through a window. The victims did not know the suspects but mentioned they had seen them frequently downtown. The suspects caused \$1,100 in City damages. Detectives investigated the incident, identified four suspects, and served search warrants on their residences. During the searches, detectives recovered evidence and ¾ pound of marijuana in a juvenile's possession. Detectives located the suspects and arrested them.

Narcan Administered Lifesaving

- Officers responded to an unhoused male to whom a citizen administered Narcan after locating him unresponsive. After regaining consciousness, the male refused transportation to CHOMP for further evaluation and medical treatment.
- An MPD officer administered four doses of Narcan to a 27-year-old unhoused male found unresponsive at the skate park. After regaining consciousness, the unhoused male refused transportation for further evaluation and medical treatment.
- An MPD officer administered three doses of Narcan to a 20-year-old unhoused male found unresponsive at Window on the Bay. After regaining consciousness, AMR transported the male to CHOMP for further evaluation and treatment.

- CAT participated in delivering Thanksgiving meals in the city.

Multidisciplinary Outreach Team (MDOT)

- CAT participated in bi-monthly meetings with SURT (Substance Use Response Team).
- CAT participated in a tour of the North American Mental Health Services facility.
- CAT participated in the Montage Drug-Free Communities Coalition meeting.
- CAT participated in a tour of the New Start Recovery Center in Pacific Grove.
- CAT/MDOT assisted an unsheltered female with resources and transportation to I-Help for women.
- CAT transported an unsheltered female to the Sobering Center and scheduled an assessment with Door to Hope for housing.
- CAT contacted CHS to schedule an assessment for an unhoused male.



Investigations / Monterey Police Anti-Crime Team (IMPACT)

- 11-01-22- Detectives investigated three commercial burglaries. Detectives identified and arrested the suspect in another jurisdiction. After detectives conducted a follow-up investigation, the District Attorney filed two burglary charges against the suspect. The suspect pled guilty before trial.
- 11-03-22- Detectives received a tip from the Internet Crimes and Against Children Task Force. After investigation, detectives determined the case was unfounded.
- 11-03-22- Detectives received information that a prison employee possessed an illegal assault weapon at his home in Monterey and was bringing the assault weapon onto prison property. Detectives served a search warrant on the suspect's home and work and found an illegal AR15 assault rifle at the residence and a loaded pistol on prison property. Detectives arrested the suspect.
- 11-04-22- Detectives responded to a shooting at an occupied vehicle and searched several locations and cars based on probation terms. Officers arrested one subject and the investigation is ongoing.
- 11-09-22- Detectives began investigating fraud involving wire transfers in Monterey. The investigation is ongoing.
- 11-09-22- Detectives investigated a sexual assault between two minors. Detectives forwarded the case to the District Attorney's office for filing.
- 11-09-22- Detectives conducted a probation search at a hotel in Marina concerning a burglary investigation in Monterey. Detectives arrested three suspects for possession of narcotics and identity theft.
- 11-10-22- Detectives conducted a follow-up investigation on a possible arson of a dumpster.
- 11-10-22- Detectives investigated an organized retail theft of approximately \$4,600 in sunglasses from a business. The investigation is ongoing.
- 11-10-22- Detectives investigated a case of fraudulent access to a bank account via ATM. The investigation is ongoing.
- 11-11-22- Detectives investigated a report of a suspect attempting to run people off the road in a vehicle while they were riding their bikes.
- 11-16-22- Detectives conducted a probation search at a motel in Monterey and arrested a female for possessing narcotic paraphernalia.



- 11-16-22- Detectives conducted a probation search of a tent off Highway 1 and arrested a suspect for possessing Fentanyl and Methamphetamine for sale. Detectives seized 58 grams of Fentanyl and other narcotics.
- 11-17-22- Detectives followed up on two auto burglaries.
- 11-11-22- Detectives investigated possible financial abuse against an elder. The investigation is ongoing.
- 11-22-212- Detectives investigated a sexual battery between two guests in a motel room.
- 11-22-22- Detectives investigated a rental scam on Craigslist.
- 11-22-22- Detectives investigated an embezzlement of \$400,000 from a business in Monterey. The investigation is ongoing.
- 11-29-22- Detectives investigated vandalism in the Old Monterey Business District. A suspect etched the glass windows of four businesses, which resulted in thousands of dollars in damage. The case is ongoing.
- 11-29-22- Detectives investigated another embezzlement case of over \$4,000 by an employee at a Monterey business. The investigation is ongoing.
- 11-29-22- Detectives investigated an attempted theft of over \$16,000 from the accounts of a Monterey Business.

Case Study -John Doe 1122 (November 2022)

In an effort to explain some of the challenges faced by the MPD in trying to problem solve through a variety of ways, these case studies highlight aspects that the MPD and partners in MDOT face while attempting to resolve issues. This month's case study provides another challenging example.

John Doe 1122 is a 55-year-old unhoused individual. Doe 1122 has had 551 police contacts since 2001. Doe's 551 police contacts increased over the years for alcohol-related incidents. DOE 1122 has been arrested for trespassing, malicious mischief, alcohol violations, restraining order violations, and warrants.

DOE'S police encounters are for public alcohol consumption, public intoxication, and sit-and-lie ordinances. DOE 1122 will sit/lie blocking sidewalks in various parts of Monterey. DOE 1122 suffers from alcoholism. Doe 1122 has been offered numerous services to help assist him with alcoholism.

- DOE has over 30 CAT/MDOT assistance contacts since 2020: The Monterey Police Department has assisted DOE 1122 by:
- Taken to Sun Street Rehabilitation.
- · Taken to DMV to obtain ID for medications
- Taken to CHOMP for sobriety detox and The Bridge Rehabilitation
- Taken to Chinatown Navigation Center
- Assisted and filled out intake paper work for living/ sobriety.

- Taken to Genesis House for Sober Living
- DOE 1122 has been refused services by Chinatown Navigation for rule violations
- DOE 1122 has been refused services by Sun Street for rule violations and personal hygienic violations
- DOE 1122 walked out of the hospital detox program
- DOE 1122 has been cited 33 times for having an open container of alcohol in public.
- DOE 1122 has been arrested 41 times for being drunk in public.
- DOE 1122 has been arrested 32 times for violating his probation (alcohol-related offenses).

Complaints related to DOE 1122 from citizens have increased. DOE 1122 will sit in public locations and stain the concrete area with his incontinence and lack of personal hygiene. DOE 1122 has refused all further assistance and sobriety methods to date. The MDOT team interacts with DOE 1122 on a constant and consistent basis.

Since 2017, DOE 1122 has had 18 case dismissals (Furtherance of Justice) from the District Attorney's office for alcohol (public intoxication) related arrests.

DOE 1122 is on informal probation (1) Year Starting in June 2022 for Drinking in Public. Part of DOE'S probation is to stay away from specific areas of the City of Monterey.



National Incident Based Reporting System

The Monterey Police Department (MPD) transitioned to the California and National Incident-Based Reporting Systems (CIBRS and NIBRS) on March 1, 2022 and has completed the required three (3) month validation period. CIBRS and NIBRS reporting meets state and federal data standards and supports the national transition to NIBRS. As the new data collection standard, NIBRS captures all offenses within an incident – up to ten crime occurrences, representing a substantial shift in crime reporting. The additional detailed crime incident data provides greater analytic capability and makes NIBRS a superior crime-reporting method when compared to the previously utilized Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) standard. MPD has fully transitioned to NIBRS reporting and discontinued UCR reporting.

This new reporting yields a different format for data collection and is divided into Group A and Group B offenses. Group A offenses are the more serious crimes such as Murder, Rape, Robbery, etc. Group B offenses tend to be minor offenses, such as Curfew, Loitering and Vagrancy Violations, Disorderly Conduct, and Driving Under the Influence.

The data is grouped into three (3) crime categories of Crimes Against Persons (counted per victim), Crimes Against Property (counted per incident), and Crimes Against Society (counted per crime against society). Crimes against persons include assault, homicide, human trafficking, kidnapping and sex offenses. Crimes against property include robbery, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson. Crimes against society include drug/narcotic offenses, gambling, pornography, prostitution, liquor law violations, disorderly conduct, peeping tom, curfew/vagrancy violations, trespassing, driving under the influence, and weapon law violations.

Law enforcement agencies report data from each offense and arrest for Group A offenses, but report only arrest data for Group B offenses. There are more offenses reported in NIBRS, more details per incident, and arrests and offenses linked in NIBRS.
