**MAJOR STREETS TO BE IMPROVED THANKS TO MEASURE P  
Del Monte Avenue, Pacific Street, Camino El Estero & Camino Aguajito  
to be Partially Closed & Repaired April 23-27**

Monterey, CA. – Some of Monterey’s most traveled streets will be resurfaced from Tuesday, April 23 to Saturday, April 27 thanks to Measure P funds. The following streets or lanes will be closed intermittently between the hours of 7 am to 7 pm:

**Tuesday, April 23**

- Eastbound Del Monte Avenue (towards Seaside), outside lane from City limit to Camino Aguajito
- Camino Aguajito from Pearl Street to Fremont Street

**Wednesday, April 24**

- Westbound Del Monte Avenue (towards Downtown Monterey), outside lane from City limit to Camino Aguajito
- Pacific Street from Madison Street to Del Monte Avenue

**Thursday, April 25**

- Del Monte Avenue, inside lanes from the Naval Postgraduate School Gate to City limit
- Pacific Street from Del Monte Avenue to Scott Street
- Camino El Estero from Pearl Street to Fremont Street

**Friday, April 26**

- Del Monte Avenue, inside lanes from the Naval Postgraduate School Gate to Camino El Estero
- Pacific Street from Lighthouse Ave to Lower Presidio Gate
- Camino Aguajito from Pearl Street to Del Monte Avenue

**Saturday, April 27**

- Del Monte Avenue, outside lane from Camino El Estero to Camino Aguajito
- Pacific Street from Martin Street to Madison Street
- Camino El Estero from Del Monte Avenue to Pearl Street

Expect street and lane closures, parking restrictions, traffic delays, construction noise and detours in the affected areas. Please take alternate routes. Schedules may change due to weather or unforeseen circumstances.

The City of Monterey is nearly finished with Measure P street, sidewalk and storm drain repairs. The sales tax measure was approved in 2014 and sunsets in 2019. The four-year program repaired more than 9 million square feet of streets citywide from neighborhoods to major thoroughfares. It also raised an additional \$14 million for storm drain and sidewalk repairs and ADA upgrades. In 2018, over 82% of voters approved Measure S, which will continue the 1% sales tax for infrastructure rehabilitation.
